STRENGTHENING RABIES AWARENESS IN SCHOOLS

Asst. Schools Division Superintendents, Curriculum Implementation Division, School Governance and To: Operations Division, Public School District Supervisors, Elementary and Secondary School Heads, School Health Personnel

- 1. This office received a report from the Office of the Provincial Veterinarian regarding the dog biting incidents that happened inside the school premises in Quezon Province.
- 2. The said dogs were examined and confirmed to be rabies positive by the laboratory.
- 3. Rabies refers to a highly fatal disease caused by a lyssa virus, transmitted mainly through the bite of an infected animal and is characterized by muscle paralysis, hydrophobia, aerophobia, and other neurological manifestations.
- 4. Republic Act No. 9842, otherwise known as the "Anti-Rabies Act of 2007" is an act providing for the control and elimination of human and animal rabies, prescribing penalties for violation thereof and appropriating funds therefor.
- 5. As stated in Section 5 Responsibilities of Pet Owners of RA No. 9842 All pet owners shall be required to:
 - (a) Have their dog regularly vaccinated against rabies and maintain a registration card which shall contain all vaccinations conducted on their dog for accurate record purposes.
 - (b) Submit their dogs for mandatory registration.
 - (c) Maintain control over their dog and not allow it to roam the streets or any public place without a leash.
 - (d) Be a responsible owner by providing their dog with proper grooming, adequate food and clean shelter.
 - (e) Within twenty-four (24) hours, report immediately any dog biting incident to the concerned officials for investigation or for any appropriate action and place such dog under observation by a government or private veterinarian.
 - (f) Assist the dog bite victim immediately and shoulder the medical expenses incurred and other incidental expenses relative to the victim's injuries.

- 6. As stated in Section 6. **Responsibilities of Government Agencies** of RA No. 9842 The following government agencies, which shall jointly implement the National Rabies Prevention and Control Program, shall be tasked to:
 - C. Department of Education
 - (1) Strengthen the rabies education program through school health teaching/curriculum.
 - (2) Assist in the dog mass immunization campaigns in the community.
 - (3) Encourage collaborative activities with the DA, DOH, DILG, DENR, NGOs, POs and other concerned sectors.
 - (4) Integrate proper information and education on responsible pet ownership in the relevant subjects in the elementary and high school levels.
- In response to the incident report, to prevent and control this fatal disease and in celebration of the Rabies Awareness Month this March, all concerned are hereby advised to:
 - strengthen rabies awareness and responsible pet ownership through non formal health teachings and/or inclusion in the curriculum.
 - eliminate dogs and cats in the school premises.
