Ivy (Iza Calzado), a young call center agent who discovers she is HIV positive when she tries to make a claim for work abroad. She's discombobulated how she contracted the virus. Vanessa (IC Mendoza), a merry young gay and stand-up comedian who engages in a variety of sexual pleasures with manifold partners. He, with his very supportive parents, is geared up and raring to go to shares her story. Merrily though keen for the exposure, Vanessa is careless and still sleeps around with anonymous strangers.

- Increase HIV/AIDS awareness among the youth.
- Encourage awareness of possible risks to HIV/AIDS
- Provide relevant information on the study about HIV/AIDS

#OKKAFREN?, explores topics related to mental illness. An insight into the lives of some students who are living with different challenges and offer a glimpse into how they cope.

Marty, a product of a broken family spends more time playing online games than studying. His father has his own family abroad while his mother is in illegal online selling. His sister got pregnant early while his brother was imprisoned for drugs. Marty turns his depression to worthless things and internet gaming.

Paula Mae was once a bright student when her parents' separation greatly affected her studies and mental state until it ended in her suicide attempt when she was bullied in school and social media and was labeled as test paper scammer.

Diego is a closet gay who's afraid to admit his gender identity to his parents. Because of social media and the help of some concerned groups, he was able to face and tell his true personality.

When due to increasing issue of mental health problems, **Mr. Calida**, the school officer, formed a group chat called **#OKKAFREN?** as an online support group for students undergoing despair, despondency, and hopelessness. Sometimes life will kick you around, but these students will realize that they're not just a survivor but a warrior and they're stronger than anything life throws them away.

There is a hope even when your sick mind tells you there isn't.

The showing of the film aims to:

- Show the challenges faced by individuals struggling with mental health issues.
- Portray the importance of understanding and support from family, friends, professionals in overcoming these challenges.
- Encourage open conversations and dismantle the stigma surrounding mental health.
