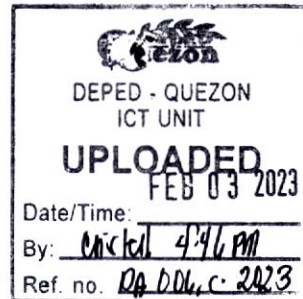

2023 UPEIQ ACADEMIC COMPETITION FOR INTERMEDIATE, JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL AND SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL LEVELS

To: All Private School Administrators, Principals and School Heads

1. Relative to the programs, projects and activities of the United Private Educational Institutions of Quezon, Inc. (UPEIQ) in the Division of Quezon, a One-Day Division Academic Competition will be conducted on **February 11, 2023, 7:30 – 5:00 pm** at Manuel S. Enverga University Foundation Candelaria, Inc., Candelaria, Quezon.

2. The activity aims to:

- foster the spirit of healthy competition among learners in a friendly quiz game that exposes them to different learning areas,
- enhance learner's knowledge and skills, and
- boost learners' self-confidence and prepare the learners for NAPSPHIL contests.

3. Participants are students of member schools with an updated institutional fee for SY 2022-2023. They are enrolled students of the private schools in the Division of Quezon for school year 2022 -2023 and an active member of UPEIQ and NAPSPHIL to qualify in the Regional Level.

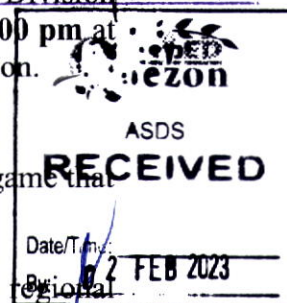
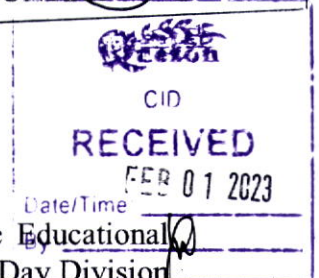
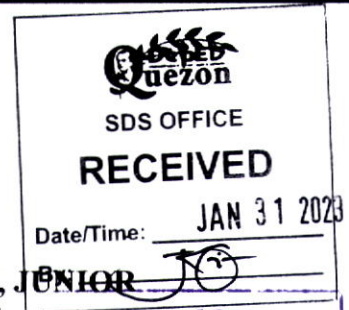
4. For Intermediate and Junior High School Levels, there will be three (3) subject areas: Science, Mathematics and English and for Senior High School level, there will be two (2) categories: SPELLING and CORE SUBJECTS

5. Contestants in all events should be organized in teams:

- three (3) members for intermediate [Grade 4 (1), Grade 5 (1), and Grade 6 (1)];
- four (4) members for Junior High School [Grade 7 (1), Grade 8 (1), Grade 9 (1) and Grade 10 (1)]
- three (3) members for the Senior High School [Grade 11 (1) Grade 12 (1) and the third member may either be Grade 11 or Grade 12


6. Pre-registration is a must and will be accomplished via google form through this link (<https://tinyurl.com/UPEIQQUIZBEE>). There will be a Registration fee of P100.00 each participant to cover the expenses during the event. Deadline for registration will be on February 7, 2023.

7. Registration starts at 7:30 am and contest commences by 9:00 am

SCHOOL YEAR 2022 – 2023**

GENERAL GUIDELINES

A. PRE-CONTEST PROPER:

1. Only UPEIQ member-schools are qualified to participate in the contests. Member schools are those with an updated institutional fee for SY 2022-2023.
2. Contestants must be bonafide students of the school they represent.
3. For **Intermediate and Junior High School Levels**, there will be three (3) subject areas:
 - a. **SCIENCE**
 - b. **MATHEMATICS**
 - c. **ENGLISH:**

Intermediate level: Grammar – Parts of Speech (Uses and Function) and Spelling

Junior High School level:

Grammar – Subject Verb Agreement and

Literature - Philippine Lit., Afro-Asian Lit., American Lit., and World Lit.

- **Grammar for Intermediate level** will focus on the uses and function of the different parts of speech.



- **Grammar for the Junior high school level** will focus on the rules of subject-verb agreement as used in the sentence.
- d. All questions for MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE and ENGLISH shall be based on K to 12 Basic Education Curriculum for Intermediate, Junior and Senior High School. It will cover Quarters 1 and 2 for Intermediate and JHS Level
4. For **Senior High School level**, there will be two (2) categories: SPELLING and CORE SUBJECTS.
 - A. SPELLING
 - a. Spelling words are limited to common English words.
 - b. The American English spelling system of Webster's Dictionary shall be followed.
 - c. No foreign derivation and scientific terms will be included. Regardless of the position in the sentence, all common nouns should be written in small letters while proper nouns should start with capital letters.
 - B. CORE SUBJECTS

The Senior High School Core Subjects are categorized into the following clusters:

 - a) Language and Literature: Oral Communication in Context, Reading and Writing Skills, 21st Century Literature from the Philippines and the World
 - b) Humanities and Social Sciences: Personal Development, Physical Education and Health, Introduction to the Philosophy of the Human Person, Contemporary Philippine Arts from the Regions, Media and Information Literacy, Understanding Culture, Society and Politics
 - c) Science and Mathematics: General Math, Earth and Life Science, Statistics and Probability, Physical Science, and Disaster Readiness and Risk Reduction
 - d) All questions shall be based on the DepEd Senior High School curriculum.
5. Contestants in all events should be organized in teams:
 - a. three (3) members for intermediate [Grade 4 (1), Grade 5 (1), and Grade 6 (1)]
 - b. four (4) members for Junior High School [Grade 7 (1), Grade 8 (1), Grade 9 (1) and Grade 10 (1)]
 - c. three (3) members for the Senior High School [Grade 11 (1) Grade 12 (1) and the third member may either be Grade 11 or Grade 12
 6. A contestant is allowed to join one contest only. Reserved student is **not allowed**.
 7. For Intermediate and Junior High School, a team is automatically disqualified if only one member is present.
 8. Each team must have a leader and an official coach.
 9. Registration fee is 100.00/participant. Deadline for registration will be on February 7, 2023.
 10. Failure to abide by the general guidelines means disqualification.
 11. Coaches and contestants are expected to:



- a. **wear school uniform and ID**
 - b. bring 1/8 size of illustration board, chalk and eraser (scratch paper will be provided by the organizers);
 - c. prohibit themselves from having consultations during the contest proper. Thus No coaches are allowed inside the room.
12. The winning team will represent the province for national level to be held on March 2023, provided that the school is an official NAPSPHIL Member for SY 2022-2023.
13. We will observe the minimum health protocols; hence, everyone is requested to wear mask, bring hand sanitizer and observe social distancing.

C. CONTEST PROPER:

1. A grace period of 5 minutes will be given to each team. If the team fails to show up after 5 minutes, the team/contestant will automatically be **DISQUALIFIED** from joining the contest.
2. Use of calculators or other electronic devices will not be allowed.
3. Cheating in any form will not be tolerated. This is a ground for disqualification.
4. Each participating schools shall prepare questions for each category and will be checked by a team of external specialists. References must be included. Deadline for the submission of questions will be on FEBRUARY 5, 2023. An email address and proper format will be shared for the different participating schools to upload questions. Please refer to the table below to determine the question to be prepared based on your District location, grade level, and Subject Area.

5. For Senior High School category, each participating school will submit objective questions per clusters (see item no.4 B – on pre contest proper) which will be screened by the official arbiters.
6. During the contest proper, contestants are expected to:
 - a. be on their designated seats;
 - b. place their team number on the upper right hand corner of the white board (The number will be determined based on the registration.); and
 - c. confer with one another in a modulated voice.
7. The quizmaster must do the following:
 - a. announces the allotted time for each round;
 - b. read the question twice;
 - c. instructs contestants to answer only after he/she says any of these words: “GO”, “START”, “BEGIN”;
 - d. declare answer as “CORRECT” or “WRONG”; and
 - e. break the tie by giving clincher question/s (“knock-out” system will be used).
8. A buzzer signals the end of the allotted time.
9. The illustration board will be raised by the team leader for checking. Answers must be written legibly, in lowest / simplest term, spelled correctly, with accurate units when needed. Answers will be considered wrong if these instructions are not followed.
10. Unless the item calls for multiple answers, the contestant should write only one answer.
11. Two official scorers will record the points in their respective tally board/sheet. The tally board will be visible to the audience.
12. **Complaints/Questions by the team leader must be raised before the next question is given.**
13. The decision of the quizmaster is final and irrevocable.
13. Trophies and cash will be awarded to winners which will be composed of First Place, Second Place and third Place respectively.

E. MECHANICS

1. There will be 40 questions per category per level. Each correct answer is equivalent to one (1) point. Participants / group who will get the highest score



will be announced as winners and will represent the province to the Regional Level

- a. All action words must be spelled in its base form.
- b. Proper syllabication must be observed.
