The Language Instruction Towards Excellence (LITE) Program of CAS-UPLB is delighted to invite you and your constituents to **Making Things LITE: Designing Play-based, Experiential, and Gamified Learning**, a webinar aimed for educators and aspiring teachers to be held on April 18, 2022 at 1PM, via Zoom. This webinar is free and a certificate will be issued to attendees.

The goal of this webinar is to impart the importance of teaching students with the use of play-based approach and providing hands-on experiences, easily connecting the lessons taught inside the classroom to real-life situations.

Dr. Ana Katrina de Jesus, Communication Division head of the UPLB Department of Humanities, will be giving a full cycle discussion of the “Bahay-bahayan” design model where teachers become game designers, students become players, and classrooms become spaces of possibilities, activated by stories and what ifs. Her study shows that “applications of the said design model have revealed that play-based, experiential, and gamified learning promotes collaboration, creativity, critical thinking, and communication, which are necessary skills to navigate the 21st century.”

The online learning event will also share sample lessons to draw insights on how such creative approaches can be applied to different learning spaces.

Due to the limited number of participants we can accommodate via zoom, we humbly request that 3-5 representatives from the schools under your jurisdiction attend the zoom session.
