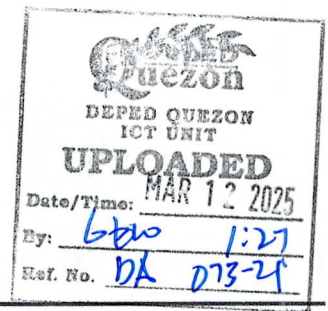

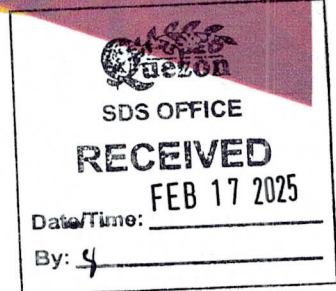

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. This year’s general theme is **“LPU-B at 58: Fusing Technology, Innovation, and Industry for the Future Workforce.”** However, the specific theme for some individual categories shall be given on the spot during the contest proper.
2. All contests will be held **face-to-face** on **March 22, 2025, Saturday, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm at LPU-Batangas Main Campus, Capitol Site, Batangas City.**
3. The competition is open to all bona fide **Grades 9 to 12 students (unless specified)** of private and public high schools in the Provinces of **Batangas, Quezon, and Laguna.**
4. Each school shall send only **one (1) contestant, pair, or group** for each category, as specified.
5. High schools with Day Class, Night Class, Open High School, Science Class, and/or BEC class under **one** official school name **may send** contestants to represent each class **provided that they have different administrators/principals.**
6. A contestant may join a **maximum of two (2) contests**, provided that the said contests **are not simultaneous.**
7. The contestants shall be in **CASUAL ATTIRE (unless specified)** to avoid school identification. No School ID shall be worn.
8. Each contestant shall be at the venue at least thirty (30) minutes before the contest. General Registration will begin at 7:00 am.
9. Each contestant must present their valid student ID during the per-contest registration for verification purposes.
10. Contests are from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm. There may be changes without prior notice. Contest venues shall be posted at the Arsenio “Dodjie” Laurel Sports Arena and in other strategic areas of the university. Marshalls will be available for assistance.

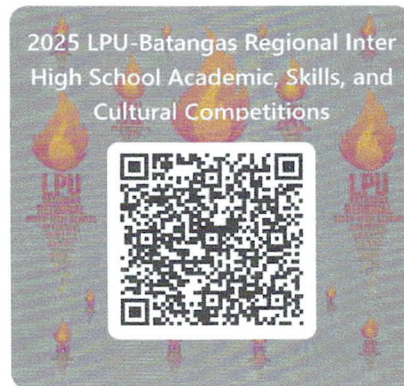

11. The points to determine the Overall Top Performing schools for all the categories shall be: **10 points - 1st place, 7 points - 2nd place, 5 points - 3rd place, 3 points –4th place, 2 points – 5th place, 1.5 points – for semi-finalist (Vocal solo and Mr. and Miss Teen LPU 2025), 1 point – participation**, will be tallied. The top 3 schools to accumulate the highest scores will be proclaimed **1st, 2nd, and 3rd OVERALL TOP PERFORMING SCHOOLS**, respectively.
12. Previous years' champions (1st Placer) of the individual categories shall not be allowed to join the same category; runners-up are permitted.
13. The decision of the judges/arbiters is final and irrevocable.
14. The awarding of all contest winners shall be conducted at the Arsenio "Dodjie" Laurel Sports Arena after the Mr. and Miss Teen LPU 2025 pageant.
15. The **deadline for the CONFIRMATION OF SCHOOL'S PARTICIPATION is on March 14, 2025 (Friday), 3:00 pm.**

HUMANITIES and SOCIETY QUIZ BEE

GUIDELINES

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9 to 12 students** of all public and private high schools in the provinces of Batangas, Quezon, and Laguna.
2. Only **one (1) PAIR of contestants per school** is allowed.
3. Prepared questions for the quiz shall be taken from the areas of **Literature and Humanities, Philippine History, World History, Current Events, Business, and Management.**
4. Scores shall be cumulative.
5. The contest shall be in three (3) rounds:
 - **First Round (Easy Round).** There shall be twenty (20) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn one (1) point.
 - **Second Round (Average Round).** There shall be ten (10) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn two (2) points.
 - **Third and Final Round (Difficult Round).** There shall be five (5) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn three (3) points.
6. Clincher questions shall be given in case of a tie to determine who shall advance to the next round and to decide the winners.
7. Each question shall be read by the Quiz Master twice. Contestants shall be given twenty (20) seconds to write their answer. The bell ringer shall signal the end of the time for writing the answer and the Quiz Master shall give the correct answer for checking.
8. Points for correct answers shall be tallied on the board.
9. Protests can only be raised by the coach/trainer and shall only be done before the next question is read. Protests should be supported by written materials of national publication such as books, magazines, and newspapers only. The Panel of Arbiters with the Chair of the Contest shall decide on the protest. The decision of the Panel of Arbiters is final.
10. Coaching during the contest is not allowed and shall be a ground for the disqualification of the contestants.
11. First, Second, and Third Prize Winners shall be based on the top three (3) pairs who shall earn the highest scores.

STEM QUIZ BEE GUIDELINES

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9 to 12 students** of all public and private high schools in the provinces of Batangas, Quezon, and Laguna.
2. Only **one (1) team composed of three (3) members per school** is allowed.
3. Prepared questions for the quiz shall be taken from the areas of **Physics, Chemistry, Biochemistry, Earth Science, Biology, Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Statistics, and Information Technology.**
4. Contestants **SHALL PROVIDE THEIR OWN SCIENTIFIC CALCULATOR** for the contest.
5. Scores shall be cumulative.
6. The contest shall be in three (3) rounds:
 - **First Round (Easy Round).** There shall be twenty (20) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn one (1) point.
 - **Second Round (Average Round).** There shall be ten (10) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn two (2) points.
 - **Third and Final Round (Difficult Round).** There shall be five (5) questions for this round and each correct answer shall earn three (3) points.
7. Clincher questions shall be given in case of a tie to determine who shall advance to the next round and to decide the winners.
8. Each question shall be read by the Quiz Master twice. Contestants shall be given at least 20 seconds to answer each question. The bell ringer shall signal the end of the time for writing the answer and the Quiz Master shall give the correct answer for checking.
9. Points for correct answers shall be tallied on the board.
10. Protests can only be raised by the coach/trainer and shall only be done before the next question is read. Protests should be supported by written materials from publications such as books and refereed journals. The Panel of Arbiters with the Chair of the Contest shall decide on the protest. The decision of the Panel of Arbiters is final.
11. Coaching during the contest is not allowed and shall be a ground for the disqualification of the contestants.
12. First, Second, and Third Prize Winners shall be based on the top three (3) groups of contestants who shall earn the highest scores.

SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOAL (SDG) DIGITAL POSTER MAKING CONTEST

GUIDELINES

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9 to 12 students** of all public and private high schools in the provinces of Batangas, Quezon, and Laguna.
2. Only **one (1) contestant per school** is allowed.
3. The digital poster entry/contest may focus on any of the following:
 - SDG 8 – Decent Work & Economic Growth
 - SDG 9 – Industry, Innovation & Infrastructure
 - SDG 11 – Sustainable Cities & Communities
 - SDG 12 – Responsible Consumption & Production

However, the final SDG focus/topic shall be announced on the actual day of the competition. The message of the digital poster entry must align with the final SDG, highlighting its goals and relevance.

4. Each participant shall be provided with a personal computer (**iMac**) installed with **adobe photoshop and adobe illustrator** for editing their entries. Participants may opt to use their own laptops in editing; however, editing must be done at the contest venue. **Only adobe photoshop and adobe illustrator are allowed to be used in editing.**
5. Inserting any flash drive, hard drive, card reader, or the likes to the personal computer provided is not allowed. Only email is allowed in sending and copying files.
6. Soft copies of all the entries must be submitted by the specified deadline, **11:30 am** on the same day of the competition. The email address shall be provided during the contest proper.
7. The entry must be accompanied by a description (75 to 100 words).
8. Submission Requirements:
 - Format: Digital posters should be submitted as JPEG or PNG.
 - Resolution: Minimum of 300 dpi to ensure quality for potential printing.
 - Dimensions in pixels: 3300 pixels per inch x 5100 pixels per inch (Portrait orientation)
 - Dimensions in inches: 11 inches (width) x 77 inches (height) (Portrait orientation)
9. Design Specifications:
 - Entries shall incorporate the university's own specially-created SDG logo in the poster. The logo shall be given on the spot.
 - Contestants affirm that their submissions are their own original work.
 - Have not been copied from others or from previous designs.
 - Have not been submitted in previous competitions or used for commercial purpose.
 - Does not include any copyrighted images, logos, or material.
 - Does not violate the intellectual property rights of any other individuals, organizations, or other creative sources.

*** Plagiarism will result in disqualification.

- Any text content should be in English.
- Visual content (illustrations, icons, typography) should be relevant to the SDG theme and support the message clearly.
- Entries that contain inappropriate content (e.g., promotion of brands, malicious or explicit content that can offend race, sex, religion, or public taste) are not allowed. The committee has exclusive authority to determine whether content is offensive or inappropriate.
- Entries or other elements of the entries that have been created with the help of Artificial Intelligence (AI) generator would lead to disqualification.

10. The following criteria will be used for judging:

- **Relevance to SDG (30%)**
(How well the poster addresses the chosen SDG and its impact.)
- **Creativity & Originality (25%)**
(Fresh, innovative ideas and artistic presentation.)
- **Design & Visual Impact (20%)**
(The overall aesthetics, use of color, typography, and layout.)
- **Message Clarity & Call to Action (25%)**
(How clear and understandable the message is in promoting awareness or action.)
(How effectively the poster inspires the audience to support the SDG or act.)

11. The competition will make use of the Ranking System in determining the placements of the contestants.

12. The top 3 contestants who incurred the highest ranks shall be proclaimed 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize winners, respectively.

13. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

(Copyright and Ownership: By submitting an entry, participants agree to grant the organizers the right to use and reproduce the material for promotional, educational, and other school-related purposes, with proper credit given to the creators. The material shall remain the intellectual property of the participant.)

TOUR GUIDING COMPETITION GUIDELINES

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9 to 12** students of all public and private high schools in the provinces of Batangas, Quezon, and Laguna.
2. Only **one (1) contestant per school** shall be allowed.
3. The theme for this category is "**Love the Philippines: Batangas,**" where the vibrant essence of Batangas Province serves as the primary focus of the competition.
4. The participant must research the following prominent Batangas Province's tourist attractions.
 - o Taal Volcano and Taal Lake
 - o Anilao (as a diving destination)
 - o Fortune Island
 - o Caleruega Church
 - o Saint Padre Pio Parish and Shrine
 - o Mt. Batulao
 - o Taal Heritage Town
 - o Masasa Beach
 - o Mt. Maculot
 - o Malabrigo Lighthouse
 - o Basilica of St. Martin De Tours
 - o Verde Island Passage
 - o Cape Santiago Lighthouse
 - o Monte Maria Shrine
 - o Marian Orchard
5. **Three (3) photos** showcasing the aforementioned attractions will be presented on the screen, requiring participants to describe them to the judges, acting as tourists.
6. The tour guiding competition and showcasing the aforementioned attractions will be conducted **live on the spot.**
7. Each participant shall be given a **minimum of three (3) minutes and a maximum of five (5) minutes** for his/her presentation including his/her introduction and closing spiels.
8. If the participant exceeds the time allotted for the presentation, **one (1) point will be deducted for every minute exceeded.**
9. The participant **must be dressed appropriately as a tour guide** and must have all the relevant props for his/her presentation. **Nothing about the attire should reveal the name and logo of the school being represented.**
10. The presentation must be delivered **in English.** However, greetings and/or closing spiels may include different dialects or native words or phrases.
11. The competition will make use of the Ranking System in determining the placements of the contestants.
12. The top 3 contestants who incurred the highest ranks shall be proclaimed 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize winners, respectively.
13. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

GUIDELINES

1. The competition is open to **Grades 9 to 12 students** of all public and private high schools in the provinces of Batangas, Laguna, and Quezon.
2. Only **one (1) contestant per school** shall be allowed.
3. Each contestant is given **two (2) hours** to prepare, cook, and plate/present a hot or cold **KAPENG BARAKO-INSPIRED dessert** on the spot.
4. The contestant must wear a chef’s jacket **or** plain white shirt, hairnet and toque **or** plain cap, and an apron. The attire should have no logo, name, or marks to identify the school being represented.
5. The dessert must be good for two (2) persons, plated individually, one for display and one for judge’s tasting. Set up of the display will not be part of the judging. Only plated dessert will be judged.
6. All ingredients (main and supplementary) shall be provided by the participants. Only ingredients in the submitted recipes will be allowed to be brought in the competition area.
7. Four (4) copies of the recipe must be submitted to the organizers before the start of the competition. These will also serve as basis of judging. Recipes should be written in the official recipe form. Each recipe should be good for two (2) persons and should stipulate ingredients, quantity (in metric form) and method of cooking. Five (5) percent allowance or buffer is allowed.
8. Pre-prepared/chopped *mise en place* is allowed but must not be cooked. Dessert sauces must be prepared on the spot.
9. Contestants must bring their own cooking utensils (pots, pans, etc.) and other small equipment (blender, mixer, etc.), adaptor, and extension cords, if needed.
10. Contestants must provide their own wares/plates. Any color is accepted but there should be no logo, name, or marks to identify the school being represented.
11. Contestants will be provided with own workplace with four-glass burner and a work area with sink. A common chiller and freezer will also be provided.
12. Contestants must register at least thirty (30) minutes before the start of the competition.
13. All ingredients and equipment of the contestants must be within the designated competition area before the start of the competition.
14. All contestants must leave the workstations in a neat and tidy condition. This is part of the judging criteria.

15. The organizers reserve the right to use the submitted entry recipes for promotional and other purposes.
16. The top 3 contestants who incurred the highest points shall be proclaimed 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize winners, respectively.

3. Fruit & Vegetable Carving will be done **on-the-spot**.

5. Going beyond the allotted time shall incur a penalty of one (1) point per minute to be deducted from the total score.
6. Each pair must provide their own working tools, fruits, and vegetables to be used in the competition. No power tools shall be used. No food color is allowed.
7. No pre-slicing, carving, or preparation of fruits and vegetables before the competition. No marks or drawings must be visible on the fruits and vegetables. Judges and organizers will check the materials before the start of the competition. Any materials with marks and drawings will be taken out.
8. All utensils and other paraphernalia should not bear any logo or identification marks of the school being represented.
9. Barbeque sticks and toothpicks are the only accessories allowed to be used. Usage of accessories not included in the list shall mean a penalty of one (1) point to be deducted from the total score.
10. Contestants can use props, linens to enhance the total presentation of the entries, however, this will not be included in judging.
11. The contestants shall at least wear white polo or t-shirt with apron and hair restraints (ex. hair net, Chef’s hat) if Chef’s uniform is not available.
12. The top 3 pairs who incurred the highest ranks shall be proclaimed 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize winners, respectively.
13. The decision of the judges is final and irrevocable.

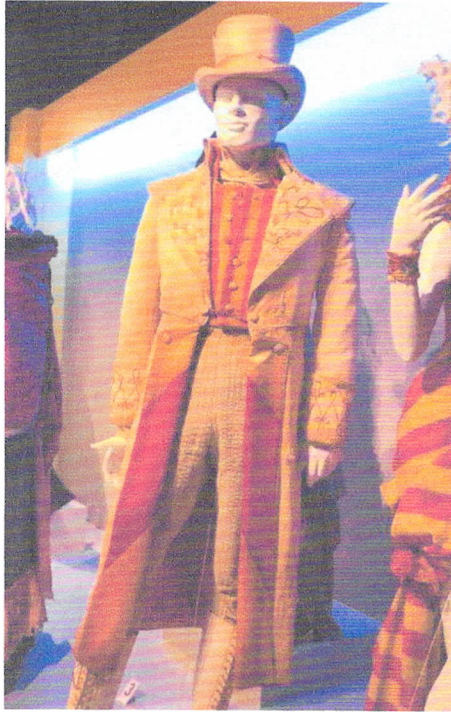
