

PROPOSAL

TRAINOR'S TRAINING on SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING AND ADOLESCENT SEXUAL REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

1. Background of RelNa Federation

Reina Federation of Parents Associations Inc. is a duly registered non-stock, non-profit federation of Parents Associations. Currently, it operates in the 26 Barangays in the municipalities of Real, Infanta and General Nakar. Reina Federation is the partner of ChildFund Philippines, in achieving the organization's vision to create a community that nurtures and develops children to become healthy, productive, responsible and free members of society.

Reina Federation was established mid of 2008 with the facilitation of ChildFund Philippines. This move was borne out of the maturity of its three member-Parent Associations, namely Luntiang Pangarap ng Real Parent Association, Inc., Infanta Community Parent Association, Inc., and Pag-asa ng Mamamayan ng Heneral Nakar Parent Association Inc., to unite their action for a common vision. The Federation was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on September 2008.

After almost 14 years of implementing age- appropriate programs and projects, the Federation continue to strive to support children to improve their lives and become leaders who bring lasting and positive change to their communities by promoting child-centered, rights-based and community-supported development programs across three life stages: which focuses on ages 0-5 for life stage 1, 6-14 under life stage 2, and 15-24 under life stage 3.

II. Rationale

For more than eight (8) years, the Reina Federation has been implementing several programs and projects with the ultimate goal of helping create a safe and progressive community that ensures the holistic development of children. For Life Stage 2, covering 6-12 years old, we had our Enhancing Numeracy and Reading through Identity and Cultural Heritage (ENRICH) program and reached around 10,000 school children, 108 teachers, and 3,000 parents/caregivers from the 19 covered schools of Reina District and accomplished beyond targets.

This year, a new project for 6-14 years old (K-8) entitled SAFE to Learn. The program aims to support every school-age child to gain grade-appropriate learning competency capable of successful grade-level transition and basic education completion based on a context-relevant and developmentally appropriate curriculum in a safe and inclusive learning environment. The SAFE to Learn Program is anchored in the Basic Education Development Plan 2030 (BEDP 2030) of which development was spearheaded by the Department of Education in collaboration with development partners and civil society organizations. Its implementation

strategy includes a response to the immediate impacts of COVID-19 on learning and participation which will guide us as we design interventions to address the learning losses and gaps incurred.

DepEd is gradually opening its schools and preparing for a "progressive expanded face-to-face classes", a set-up wherein pupils will go to class for 4 days, and work on their modules at home for 1 day. Consequently, they will experience massive challenges in bridging learning gaps, keeping children in school in the middle of price hikes of transportation and basic commodities, and sustaining the support of parents to accomplish school tasks at home.

Moreover, Dep-Ed has its Youth Formation program that primarily support the various organized children and youth groups in school such as SPG, SSG, Yes-O, Barkada Kontra Droga, Gulayan sa Paaralan and Child Protection Policy. Likewise, the Adolescent Reproductive Health (ARH) Program is one of the flagship programs of Oplan Kalusugan sa Department of Education which aims to promote and safeguard the reproductive health of learners through education and information as it strengthens the mandates of Responsible Parenthood and Reproductive Health Act of 2012. During the consultation meeting conducted, a collaborative effort with Reina Fed in the organizing of Volunteer Peer Advocates as one of the programs of SSG was conceptualized. This project will be piloted in the 4 National High Schools in REINA District supported by DepEd-Quezon YFD and ARH Program Team of School Health Section in partnership with the Provincial Integrated Health Office (IPHO)-POPCom.

Since the SAFE to Learn Project is catering to 13- 14 years old, it is high time to provide them with relevant sessions about Adolescent Sexual Reproductive Health, 10 Life Skills, and Reproductive Health Rights. The awareness raising on the prevention of Teenage Pregnancy and other pertinent issues to adolescent sexual health shall be part of the advocacy of the schools and communities. Therefore, Trainor's Training shall be conducted to organize a pool of Facilitators that can facilitate during Child & Youth Development Sessions and at the same time be an advocate of the said program.

III. Scope and Tasks

Specifically, the training aims to:

- Enhance the evolving capacities and abilities of the participants by providing them training on Facilitating Skills & ASRH Concepts.
- Obtain children & youth commitment to fulfill the responsibilities as Volunteer Peer Advocates.
- Develop pool of VPAs who can confidently facilitate the child & youth development sessions both in school-based and community-based.
- To conduct planning on how the Dep-Ed, VPAs and the Federation will support each other hand in hand to achieve the goal of the project.

IV. Time Frame/ Venue

The training is schedule on September 17 & 18, 2022 at Nawawalang Paraiso Hotel , Tayabas , Quezon
