### School Level

- All SPG and SSG/YES-O/GPP/BKD Student leaders, Teacher-advisers and School Heads of public schools with an on-going project may join the Search.
- The teacher-adviser of the school SPG/SSG shall submit all the Application Form No. 1-4 with attachment/MOV in all categories to their respective district offices.
- Deadline of submission of the application form and attachments to the district offices is on June 22, 2022.

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### II. District Level

- The District School Heads In-charge of Youth Formation shall serve as the Chair of the Screening Committee in the District Level together with the, District Focal Person for Supreme Government, YES-O, BKD and GPP as indicated in the district screening committee.
- The District Office shall receive the application forms of the participating schools. They shall notify if all the requirements were met.
- Using the given criteria, they shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents.
- 4. The District Screening Committee shall use the score sheet provided in the memo.
- Stakeholders, like city councilor in-charge of youth development may be invited during the screening.
- One finalist per category will be selected and shall be forwarded to the respective suboffices for the cluster level screening.

## III. Cluster Level

- The assigned School Heads In-charge of Governance and Operations (SHIGO) shall be the Chair on the Cluster Level Screening together with the co-SHIGOs.
- The Sub-Office shall receive the application forms of the district finalists.
- The Chair of the Screening Committee shall coordinate with the schedule of respective sub-office for the reservation of the venue.
- SHIGOs shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents.
- 5. One finalist per category will be selected and forwarded to the division office.

### IV. Division Level

 The ASDS in-charge of SGOD shall serve as the Chair of the Awards Committee in the Division Level together with the Co-Chair, SGOD Chief and members SGOD Education Program Supervisor, Planning and Research Section, Social Mobilization and Networking Section, School Management, Monitoring and Evaluation Section, and

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Human Resource Development Section as indicated in the composition of the screening committee.

- The Division Office shall receive the application forms of the cluster finalists. They shall notify the participating schools if all the requirements were met.
- The Division Office shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents using the given criteria.
- 4. The Division Screening Committee shall use the score sheet provided by in the memo.
- The Division Screening Committee will select six winners per category; three from elementary and three from high school.
- The Division Winners shall receive a certificate of recognition from the Division Office, and medals for the individual category. All non-winning cluster school finalists shall receive certificate of participation.

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

- The members shall record the Minutes of the Meeting (MOM) of the SC and shall consolidate the results of the evaluation.

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
