

Division Awarding

I. School Level

- 1. All SELG and SSLG/YES-O/BKD student leaders, teacher-advisers and school heads of public schools with an on-going project may join the search.
- The teacher-adviser of the school SELG/SSLG shall submit all the Application Form No. 1-4 with attachment/MOV in all categories to their respective district offices.
- 3. Deadline of submission of the application form and attachments to the district offices is on September 1, 2023.

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II. District Level

- The District School Heads In-charge of Youth Formation shall serve as the Chair of the Screening Committee in the District Level together with the, District Focal Person for Supreme Learner Government, YES-O, and BKD as indicated in the district screening committee.
- 2. The District Office shall receive the application forms of the participating schools. They shall notify if all the requirements were met.
- 3. Using the given criteria, they shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents.
- 4. The District Screening Committee shall use the score sheet provided in the memo.
- 5. Stakeholders, like city councilor in-charge of youth development may be invited during the screening.
- 6. One finalist per category will be selected and shall be forwarded to the division office for the congressional level screening.

III. Congressional Level

- 1. The assigned Public Schools District Supervisor (PSDS) shall be the Chair on the Congressional Level Screening together with the co-PSDSs.
- 2. The Records Office shall receive the application forms of the district finalists.
- PSDSs shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents.
- 4. One finalist per category will be selected and forwarded as the division finalist.

IV. Division Level

 The ASDS in-charge of SGOD shall serve as the Chair of the Awards Committee in the Division Level together with the Co-Chair, SGOD Chief and members SGOD/CID Education Program Supervisors, Planning and Research Section, Social Mobilization and Networking Section, School Management, Monitoring

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- and Evaluation Section, and Human Resource Development Section as indicated in the composition of the screening committee.
- 2. The Division Office shall receive the application forms of the division finalists. They shall notify the participating schools if all the requirements were met.
- 3. The Division Office shall conduct the paper screening and evaluation of the submitted documents using the given criteria.
- 4. The Division Screening Committee shall use the score sheet provided by in the memo.
- 5. The Division Screening Committee will select six winners per category; three from elementary and three from high school.
- 6. The Division Winners shall receive a certificate of recognition from the Division Office, and medals for the individual category. All non-winning congressional school finalists shall receive certificate of participation.

- 1. Each screening committee shall follow the prescribed GAWAD ALAB Screening Committee composition.
- 2. The Chair shall lead the Screening Committee (SC), the Chair must be present in all scheduled screenings related to the Search.
- 3. The SC must have the chair present and a quorum to proceed with the screening sessions.
- 4. The members shall arrange and evaluate all the documents of the

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applicants, and other logistical requirements needed by the SC.

5. The members shall record the Minutes of the Meeting (MOM) of the SC and shall consolidate the results of the evaluation.
