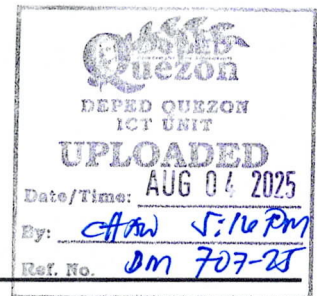

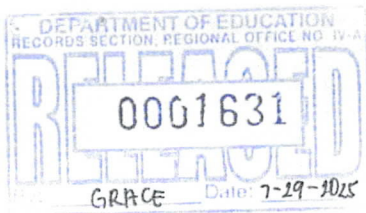


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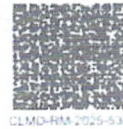

**WORKSHOP ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF STORYBOOKS
FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG ADULT LEARNERS**

To **Schools Division Superintendents**

1. In line with the region's continuous pursuit of excellence in instructional material development and the promotion of local cultural heritage through literature and visual arts, the Department of Education Regional Office IV-A CALABARZON shall conduct the Workshop on the Development of Storybooks for Children and Adult Learners on August 5-8, 2025, at a venue to be announced in a separate advisory.
2. The activity aims to enhance the competencies of teacher-writers and illustrators in developing high-quality storybooks aligned with the standards of Gawad Teodora Alonso (GTA). The workshop will equip participants with skills in creative writing, culturally responsive storytelling, age-appropriate illustration techniques, and integrating literacy elements into contextualized learning resources.
3. Please refer to **Enclosure 1** for the Indicative Program of Activities.
4. Participants are advised to bring their previously developed or drafted manuscripts or illustrations, a personal laptop with an extension cord, and art materials for illustrators. Writers for Young Adult Stories are also requested to bring and submit a one-page storyline or synopsis for use during the workshop.
5. Board and lodging of the identified participants will be shouldered by the Regional Fund, while travel expenses shall be charged against any available local funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
6. Compensatory Time-off (CTO) or Service Credits shall be granted in lieu of the days that will fall on weekends and holidays in accordance with DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003, Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to teachers, and CSC-DBM Joint Circular No. 2, s. 2015, Policies and Guidelines on Overtime Services and Overtime Pay for Government Employees.
