

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

AWARDING OF BEST PRACTICES IN CALABARZON FOR 2022-2023 HEALTHY LEARNING INSTITUTIONS PILOT

I. Background

Republic Act No. 112233 or the Universal Health Care Act enshrines the Department of Health's (DOH) partnership with education national government agencies, specifically the Department of Education (DepEd), in developing schools to become healthy settings and promoting health literacy among Filipino learners. The Health Promotion Framework Strategy (HPFS) (DOH Administrative Order No. 2020-0042) adopts a settings-based approach for health promotion. With a settings-based approach, schools or learning institutions are recognized to be built environments that can serve as important avenues to deliver population-based health interventions, age-appropriate health education, as well as the implementation of health promoting policies.

In 2022-2023, a pilot with forty-four (44) last-mile elementary schools in Quezon Province and thirty (30) in Batangas Province is being conducted to:

- 1. Assess the feasibility for schools with limited resources to implement a package of school-based interventions for health promotion;
- 2. Validate the approach of using the WHO 6 pillars of a healthy school as a framework for institutionalizing policies, structures, and mechanisms to help schools progress towards HLI status;
- 3. To identify key operational issues, enabling and hindering factors in the institutionalization process; and
- 4. Identify the best ways for DOH, DepEd and local government units can work together to accelerate processes of institutionalizing healthy learning institutions

This pilot seeks to augment the three (3) of OK sa DepEd flagship programs — school-based mental health, comprehensive sexuality education / adolescent reproductive health (CSE/ARH), immunization. The target audience for the HLI pilot would be Grade 4 to 6 public school students, specifically those in DepEd's last-mile elementary schools (LMES).

The recognition and awarding of learning institutions and implementers working toward the creation of HLIs is recognized as an implementing strategy to incentivize good performance toward the achievement of HLI-related goals. As such, implementing Provinces or Cities are encouraged to recognize and award the following:

- 1. Best HLI pilot schools;
- 2. Best practices for HLI;
- 3. Best HLI champion;
- 4. Best in PA 3: Immunization;
- 5. Best in PA 5: Mental Health; and,
- 6. Best in PA 6: Sexual and Reproductive Health.

II. Objectives

The objectives of the HLI Regional Awards for the 2022-2023 HLI Pilot is to incentivize schools' and implementers' performance toward achievement of Quezon and Batangas Province for the HLI framework.

III. Participants

All implementing schools and school-level implementers, Province- or City-level implementers (i.e. from the Provincial Health Office and the Schools Division Office), as well as implementers from other involved offices (ex. Municipal- or barangay-level implementers) may be invited to the Awarding Ceremony for the 2022-2023 HLI Pilot.

These participants may also be eligible for awards as written in Section IV (Evaluation Timeline and Criteria) of this Concept Note.

IV. Evaluation Timeline and Criteria

For the 2022-2023 HLI Pilot, it is recognized that extraordinary efforts to transform schools into HLIs must be awarded. As such, the following are the recommended categories and amounts for prizes for Regional awards:

This represents a person who is a strong advocate for Healthy Learning Institutions, actively championing to help transform their schools to become healthy learning institutions. This does not necessarily have to be a school head, but could be any personnel from the school. This person would be jointly selected by provincial health office staff and DepEd staff based on their interactions (e.g. monitoring visits, Kamustahan sessions, report submissions) throughout the months of HLI implementation.	

Schools may receive more than one award (ex. Best HLI Pilot school and Best practices award). All schools are to submit proposals for the HLI Regional Awards, in the form of a 5-10 page slide deck for consideration of the PHO and SDO. The slide decks may be structured as follows:

Shortlisted entries, as follows, will be asked to provide 3-5-minute presentations on their achievements during the recognition ceremony for judges to consider:

- 1. Top three schools considered for best HLI Pilot School
- 2. Top three practices considered for best practices for HLI.

The following will act as judges during the Awarding Ceremony for the HLI Province- or City-Level Awards:

1. Two (2) representative from the Center for Health Development (CHD) - Health Promotion Unit

- 2. One (1) representative from the Provincial DOH Office (PDOHO) or Center for Health Development (CHD) Health Promotion Unit
- 3. Two (2) representatives from the DepEd Schools Division Office (SDO)
- 4. Two (2) representatives from the Provincial Health Office (PHO)
